### Who can volunteer?

Anyone who is kind, caring and reliable. All of our volunteers will:

- Receive an induction before they start.
- Have travel expenses reimbursed.
- Be supported by our staff and receive on-going training.
- Have the necessary PVG scheme for Scotland care homes ONLY or DBS check (formerly CRB) which is a legal requirement when working with our residents. We will of course cover the cost of this.
