It's a great way for us to support our residents to stay connected with their local communities and have the special one-to-one time and stimulation that volunteers can offer.

Not all of our residents have family or friends who can visit them regularly so volunteers can offer a valuable link to the wider world, by giving their attention to individual residents, or by sharing their skills and experiences with a small group.

how much time will it involve?

The easy answer is as little or as much time as you like - from a couple of hours a week to a few days a month. At Sanctuary Care, we appreciate that our volunteers are giving up their free time to support us which is why we are flexible to meet everyone's needs. We do however require a six month commitment.
